Ronell was born in the Ciskei, South Africa in 1951, completed her studies in the Eastern Cape and has been living in Namibia since 1978.

A self-taught artist, she joined the well-known Namibian artist, Christine Marais, and the Desert Painters in 1980 whilst living in Swakopmund. After moving to Walvis Bay, where she taught at the local English medium Duneside High School, she continued on her own, applying what she had learnt from Christine.

She established an annual art exhibition in Walvis Bay for the coastal painters which ran successfully for the next 30 years. Some hard work was put into having fund-raising exhibitions in aid of the Cancer Association, the SPCA, Jonah Home and Smile Train in India.

In 1996 she, for the first time, entered three paintings for the prestigious Standard Bank Biennale Art Exhibition and did so successfully for the next years. Her first solo exhibition was in 1999 at 'Die Muschel', Swakopmund followed by another one there as

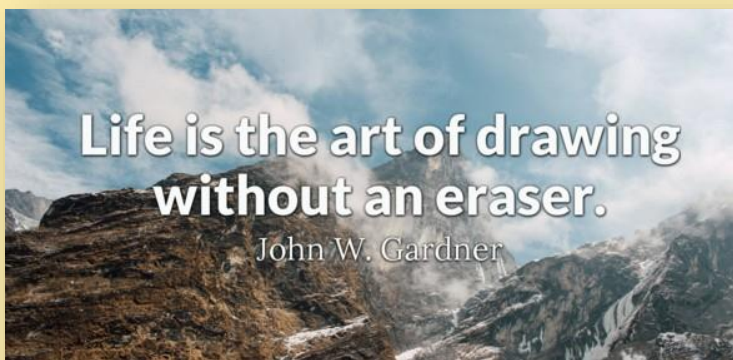
well as two at 'Die Galerie', Walvis Bay. Over the years she regularly participated in group exhibitions in Walvis Bay, Swakopmund and Windhoek.

Her work covers a variety of techniques, using palette knife or brush, using different mediums ranging from acryl to watercolour and mixed media. She covers a vast range of subjects, enjoying to experiment with new approaches. Through her work she expresses her life's journey, physically and emotionally, travelling being a great part of it, observing and filing it in the corners of her mind, whether exhilarating or touching, or to express an urgency of putting down an observation that may be lost in time.
